

#### Profile of Pioneer Member Joe T. Fox

Our Pioneer Association member, Joe T. Fox is a native Texan, born her in Dallas. He can trace his family back many years. His great grandfather, August Fox, Sr. was born in Germany in 1838. He immigrated through New Orleans with his wife from Germany, Louisa Muller.

They lived in Jefferson, Texas and then after the Civil war they moved to Dallas where they established their home. Their house was located in the area now known as Griffith Street and Stemmons Freeway. As their family grew, homes were built in that same area for their four children.

Joe T. Fox, born in 1926, attended Hogg Grade School and earned his degree from SMU in 1949. Joe married Mary Glascock in 1946 and they had one daughter, Ann.

Joe participated as an engineer with the City of Dallas from 1947-55. He changed careers and worked as the First National bank. Later he served as CEO of Bruton Properties which developed land along Stemmons Freeway. He concluded his career as an investment advisor.

In his spare time, Joe enjoyed traveling with his family and he fondly recalls playing tennis for many years. The Pioneers are proud to have a member of such a longtime Dallas family in their Associations.

A lot of activity concerning cemeteries and pioneer history in the county:

On Sunday afternoon March, 4th about 3:30 there will be a tour of the Western Heights Cemetery where many of the early settlers of Dallas are buried. Join in that afternoon as the Ft. Worth Ave. Development Group and the Bike Friendly Oak Cliff is sponsoring this event. I am looking up who all is buried here!

Several of us have started sorting the donations that have been stored in several places through the years. We are sorting through old financial records and only keeping the necessary items. The minutes of DCPA from when it was re-organized with Judge Nelms and others are of course being saved. There are several albums of what all has taken place since the 1970s. Some great photos, too.

There is research that shows where many of the Dallas County pioneers came from. The Federal Census can now be viewed for 1930. In 1860 there were over 8000 people in Dallas County and reveals where they were born.! The three Volumes published by DCPA have the stories of many of these families. I have sent letters to the libraries in the states, and mentioned to them that the family stories are in our books. We are offering them to the libraries for \$75.00. If you are into genealogy and know where your family lived before coming to Texas why don't you make a donation of DCPA's books to the county, state or city library. Let them know what happened to these folks who loaded up their wagons and came to Texas! Think about it!

If you have any memories to share about this section of Dallas we want to know. The area is Ross, Henderson, Fitzhugh, and Alcott. This area would include the Ross Ave. Baptist Church, Merchants State Bank, and was where the Chris and Anna Moser had a dairy. Let me know!
