Please look for signs as this is NOT the Auditorium where we met last year.


The Auditorium is being used for Lenten Services, so this is a one time change.

MARCH PROGRAM HISTORY OF WHITE ROCK LAKE

Come take a journey through time! Discover how White Rock Lake has moved from a water source 10 miles outside of Dallas to an urban oasis enjoyed by over two million visitors a year.

Presented by Sally Rodriguez. Sally has a Degree in Recreation from University of North Texas and has worked for the City of Dallas Park and Recreation Department since 1981. She has worked in various positions across the city, including: Managing recreation centers and District Manager responsible for parks and recreation centers for about 1/6th of the city. She is currently working as a Coordinator in the Planning, Design, Construction and Facility Services Division. She is responsible for: Maintaining the Geographical Information System databases for the department, Graphics and presentations, Historical research and Promoting the historic legacy of the Dallas Park System. She is the author of the recently released book by Arcadia Publishing "Images of America White Rock Lake"

The organizers of the Fifteenth Annual *Legacies* Dallas History Conference welcome proposals from both professional and lay historians on topics related to the theme: "The Unusual Side of Dallas: Unique Personalities, Impossible Dreams, Unexpected Landmarks, and Lingering Legends."

Although Dallas often has a reputation as a rather serious, business-minded city, it has nurtured plenty of colorful figures (such as H. L. Hunt) and surprising endeavors (like navigating the Trinity River). Registered city landmarks include an all-concrete house built more than a hundred years ago by a man who believed in reincarnation. Popular legends include the mysterious "Lady of White Rock Lake." The conference planners hope to enlighten and entertain attendees with such out-of-the-ordinary stories.

All papers must be based on original research and must not have been presented or published elsewhere. The best papers will be published in a subsequent issue of *Legacies: A History Journal for Dallas and North Central Texas*. Those interested in presenting papers should submit a brief summary of their proposal by JULY 1, 2013, to "Dallas History Conference, 1515 S. Harwood St., Dallas, TX 75215," or by email to: mvhazel@sbcglobal.net. Those selected will be notified by August 1, 2013.

The Fifteenth Annual *Legacies* History Conference will be held on Saturday, January 25, 2014. The Dallas County Pioneer Association is one of a dozen historical organizations and libraries that jointly sponsor the conference each year.

George W. Cook passed away on December 1, 2012. The original Dallasite was born in Oak Cliff in 1949. He graduated from Highland Park High School and went on to earn a BBA and MBA from what is now known as the University of North Texas in Denton. After a career in banking and investments, he spent his retirement studying, collection, and writing about Dallas middle class history and Dallas historical photography. One of the things he was known for was his post card collection and original photographs about Dallas. He was proceeded in death by his parents, Martha and Gus Cook.
