"Revitalization and Restoration of Fair Park" Willis Cecil Winters, FAIA

Willis Winters is an Assistant Director with the Dallas Park and Recreation Department, where he directs planning and capital development for one of the largest park systems in the nation. Since 1993, he has been responsible for the ongoing restoration of Fair Park and the historic components of the Dallas park system. Under Mr. Winters' direction, the Park and Recreation Department has been recognized with over twenty local, state and national preservation awards.

Mr. Winters is active in both the American Institute of Architects and Preservation Dallas. He has been recognized by Dallas AIA with its two highest awards, Young Architect of the Year and the President's Medal. He served as Vice President of Dallas AIA in 1994 and has served on the Board of Directors of the Dallas Architectural Foundation and the Dallas Center for Architecture. He has been recognized by both Preservation Dallas and Preservation Texas with their highest awards for public service. He has served on the Master of Urban Planning Professional Advisory Council at Texas A&M University and currently serves on the Dean's Advisory Council at the University of Texas at Arlington School of Architecture. In 2008 Mr. Winters was elevated to the College of Fellows of the American Institute of Architects.

Mr. Winters has written extensively for *Texas Architect* magazine since 1988 and currently serves as a Contributing Editor for that publication. He was the principal writer for *The AIA Guide to Dallas Architec*-

Annual Dallas History Conference Seeks Proposals

The organizers of the Thirteenth Annual *Legacies* Dallas History Conference welcome proposals from both professional and lay historians on topics related to the theme: "Defining the Spirit of Dallas."

Papers might focus on an individual who, in the presenter's opinion, personified the spirit of the city, or political or civic milestones, or events related to sports, transportation, or the arts that in some way helped to define the spirit of the city.

All papers must be based on original research and must not have been presented or published elsewhere. The best papers will be published in a subsequent issue of *Legacies: A History Journal for Dallas and North Central Texas*. Those interested in presenting papers should submit a brief summary of their proposal by JULY 1, 2011, to "Dallas History Conference, 1515 S. Harwood St., Dallas, TX 75215." Those selected will be notified by August 1, 2011.

The Thirteenth Annual *Legacies* History Conference will be held on Saturday, January 28, 2012 at the Hall of State at Fair Park. The Dallas County Pioneer Association is among twelve historical groups that jointly sponsor the conference each year.

DCPA member Howard Cox presented a fascinating and informative paper on Dallas dairies at the 2009 conference, which was published in that fall's issue of *Legacies*. It would be great to feature another DCPA member in 2012!

ture, published in 1999 by McGraw Hill. He was co-author of *Crafting Traditions: The Architecture of Mark Lemmon*, which was published in 2005 by the Meadows Museum and SMU Press. He co-authored *Great American Suburbs: The Houses of the Park Cities, Dallas*, published in 2008 by Abbeville Press. Last year, he co-authored *Transformations: The Architects, Buildings and Events that Shaped Dallas Architecture* for the American Institute of Architects Dallas Chapter. His first solo book, *Fair Park*, was also published in 2010 by Arcadia Publishing. Mr. Winters has been recognized twice for his writing by the Texas Society of Architects with the John G. Flowers Award for Excellence in the Promotion of Architecture through the Media. Currently, Mr. Winters is working on two additional writing projects: *The Buildings of Texas*, for the Society of Architectural Historians and the University of Virginia Press and *The Architecture of Charles Stevens Dilbeck*.
